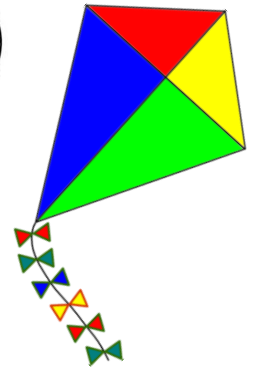


Dear Mom and Dad,

 And one ends in a box.



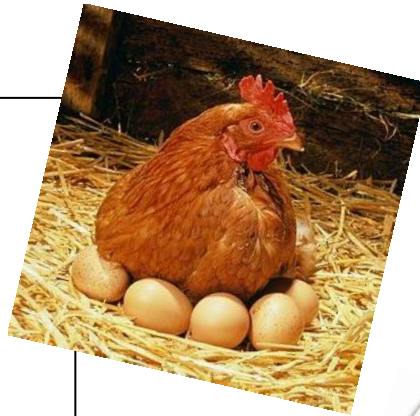
Math:

Watch out for our **ROCKING** performance!

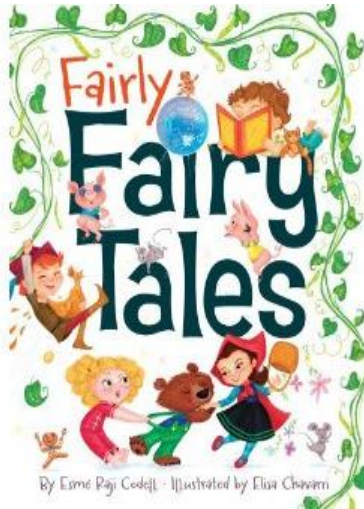

Connect what your child reads with what happens in life. If reading a book about animals, relate it to your last trip to the zoo.



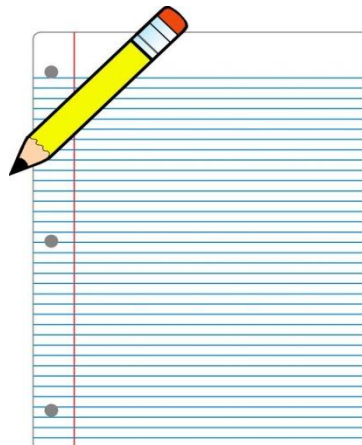
Say silly tongue twisters.
